


Museum Entrance

When you enter the museum




You will see the Printing Gallery and shop near the Front Desk.

There is a hand dryer in the accessible toilet. All toilets have paper towels in them.

You can use the two staircases or the lift to get to each floor. The lift is noisy especially when the doors are opening and closing. Please ask a volunteer if you need to use the lift.









Top Floor



This is the Fleece to Piece gallery.

The other gallery on this floor, 20th Century Worsted Manufacture, will open later in 2025.

You might be able to hear the TV playing a video and the looms. You can ask for the sound to be turned off and the loom will only be on when asked for.

You can touch the models in front of 'Barbara', the museum's sheep and there are some activities using wool that our volunteers can show you.

This is the Classic Carpets, Cork and Leather gallery.

The machines in this gallery are not currently working, but will be loud when they are on.

You may be able to hear a ticking clock and a video playing on TV screens.



You may see and hear 'Felix'. Felix moves from side to side making a whirring sound. This will only happen if a button is pressed.





You may be able to touch cork, leather and the carpets on display.








First Floor - Moquette Loom



The Moquette Loom is only on when someone asks a volunteer to turn it on. It is very loud when turned on.

You will also be able to hear this on other floors.

The floor will vibrate when it is on.









Also on this floor is Sock Knitting, the Special Exhibition Area, Washing Machines and Wire Drawing. The Special Exhibition Area may look different each time you visit.







You may hear TV screens playing films and machines running in the Wire gallery.

Later in 2025, you may also be able to hear the steam powered machines. These will only be turned on when a volunteer is asked to.






Cafe
